[redacted] 1957, advised that DOROTHY DAVENPORT, a member of the Pittsburgh Temple, stated on that date that the Pittsburgh Temple would hold a feast and MALCOLM LITTLE would attend. The date of this feast was not indicated. b7D

[redacted] 1958, advised that at a meeting of the Pittsburgh Temple held on [redacted] 1958, ROBERT DAVENPORT stated that MALCOLM X, Minister from New York City, visited the Pittsburgh Temple on [redacted] 1958, but could not stay because he was due in Detroit on [redacted] 1958. b7D

ACTIVITY AT SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA

[redacted] 1957, advised that MALCOLM X from New York and ROBERT MUHAMMAD from Chicago attended a meeting of the San Diego, California, Temple on [redacted] 1957. [redacted] advised that LITTLE described the trip as an "inspection." b7D

ACTIVITY AT SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA

[redacted] 1957, advised that MALCOLM LITTLE, New York City, was present at a meeting of the San Francisco Temple held on [redacted] 1957. He stated that LITTLE addressed those in attendance praising ELIJAH MUHAMMAD and stated "We must be self-sufficient in everything such as banks, stores and factories if we are to succeed." b7D

According to [redacted] LITTLE indicated that the Muslims have purchased two blocks of land in Chicago, Illinois, for future construction of factories and stated b7D

ACTIVITY AT SPRINGFIELD, MASSACHUSETTS

[REDACTED] 1957, advised that MALCOLM LITTLE was in attendance at a meeting of the Springfield, Massachusetts, Temple of the NOI held on [REDACTED] 1957. 67D

ACTIVITY AT WASHINGTON, D.C.

The "New York Amsterdam News," November 30, 1957, edition carried an article captioned "Malcolm Shabazz Spoke at DC Brotherhood Feast," which read as follows:

"Malcolm Shabazz, a leader of Muhammad's Temple No. 7 on Lenox Ave. at 120th St., was one of several speakers from the New York area who recently addressed a 'Brotherhood Feast' in Washington, D.C.

"The festival, distinguished by the abstinence from drinking and smoking practiced by the sect, was held in the Masonic Hall and was designed to foster 'unity among the Muslims in North America under the leadership of Mr. Elijah Muhammad.' Over a thousand people attended.

"Other speakers included Thomas J. X. of Hartford, Conn.; Ulysses X. of Jersey City, N. J., and George X. of Philadelphia, Pa. Muhammad was represented at the feast by his wife, Clara, a son and two daughters and a grandchild."

[REDACTED] 1957, advised that MALCOLM X of New York City addressed a feast sponsored by the Washington, D.C. Temple in Washington on [REDACTED] 1957. 67D
