b7D [REDACTED] MALCOLM X had conferences with CASSIUS CLAY and his brother, RUDOLPH, and he tried to instill confidence in CLAY prior to the fight. He also reported that MALCOLM X said he would return to Miami in March, 1964, and also made the statement, "If you think CASSIUS CLAY was loud, wait until I start talking on the first of March".

b7D [REDACTED] believed MALCOLM X might oppose the NOI leadership of ELIJAH MUHAMMAD with the assistance of CLAY in the near future.

b7D [REDACTED] did not know of any other prominent member of the NOI in Miami at the time of the LISTON - CLAY fight. [REDACTED]
