Last evening, [redacted] the "New York Journal American" in New York City telephoned and talked to Wick. He referred to the statement made by Malcolm X, who broke from the Black Muslims, encouraging Negroes to procure arms and become members of rifle clubs so as to take part in acts of violence. [redacted] asked if Mr. Hoover would comment on the audacity of Malcolm X in this regard.

Wick told [redacted] that Mr. Hoover was not in the office at the time therefore, we could not be of help and Mr. Hoover would have no comment to make.
